ENROLMENT PROCESS

- A **Birth Certificate** or proof of date of birth is required in order to enrol to start school.
- An **Immunisation Certificate** is also required upon enrolment.

When enrolling your child, we will talk to you about our school and answer any questions you may have. It is a good opportunity for you to share information with us about your child's health, their friends and any other factors that will support us in settling her/him into our school.

COMMUNICATION WITH TEACHERS

Regular communication between parent and teachers is very important to the educational progress of your child. When dropping off, or picking up your child, please feel free to chat to the class teacher about the daily events etc. As you will understand, it is not convenient for interviews to be held during teaching sessions or right on bell times, however, these can be arranged for a mutually acceptable time. All teachers will be happy to communicate with you via email or text message. Please discuss this possibility with your child's teacher. We encourage families to give their email addresses and mobile phone numbers to the class teacher as this will allow for quick and easy communication on a regular basis.

If you have concerns, please do not hesitate to call the school as we can only help when we are aware of the problem. By working together with the school we are sure you will find that your concerns are more easily solved.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

Our school welcomes parent involvement and is fortunate to have active participation by parents at both a formal and informal level. School Council, its sub committees and Parents and Friends are formal areas of involvement. Participation is also experienced in areas such as reading in classrooms, sport, canteen and social/fundraising activities.

PARENTS AND FRIENDS

What does the Parents and Friends do for you and the school?

The P&F is run by a small army of parents and friends volunteering their time to make our school awesome for **EVERYONE.** Our volunteers don't just concentrate on areas that benefit their own children; they work tirelessly for the whole school community.

Fundraising – without the P&F there would be no disco, Mother's day stall, Father's day stall and no fundraising to purchase extra supplies or equipment for the school. The profit generated by the P&F at our school has greatly benefited all our students in a huge way. The P&F was able to donate \$20,000 of fundraising money to assist in the purchase of the spider web in the playground. It was one of the many great things P&F has been able to donate to the school amongst other things.

We would **LOVE** to see some new faces come and join the P&F. New faces mean new ideas, it eases the workload of our current volunteers and it means we can do more for all of the kids at our school. We hold meetings once a month and it only costs \$1 to join the committee. 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In 2011 we opened our brand new BER (Building Education Revolution) Building. This is a state of the art complex building, which houses Grades 3/4 and 5/6. This complex features a semi-open learning environment, withdrawal spaces, community areas and the latest in ICT facilities. All Junior rooms have been extended and upgraded. HOW WE TEACH THE WORKSHOP MODEL

Children **NEED** time to practice new learning to transfer new information to long term memory.

Therefore, across the entire school we use the Workshop Model Structure to maximise time in the classroom!

1 HOUR LESSON

REFLECTION (2-5 min) LEARNING INTENTION & SUCCESS CRITERIA (2-5 min) Teacher shows students both *WHAT* they will be learning and *HOW* to be succesful in the lesson.

Students need to provide evidence of learning to the teacher.

MINI LESSON (10-15 min)

Teacher shows students both WHAT and HOW to do the work during work time.

AUTHENTIC WORK TIME (20 min)

Students read, write, talk and work on personal goals or strategies.

Students can have earned choice of task (if successful in 1st work time)

WORK TIME (20 min)

Students: read, write and/or talk to work with the content and the learning intention.

Cobram Primary uses the workshop model across all year levels in Literacy and Numeracy.

A MINDFULNESS APPROACH TO LEARNING

Mindfulness is defined as "a mental state achieved by focusing one's awareness on the present moment, while calmly acknowledging and accepting one's feelings, thoughts, and bodily sensations."

In simple terms, we use a mindfulness approach to ensure that children are calm and ready to learn. Mindfulness activities usually take place during the transition into a classroom. The activities only take a few minutes – however, the impact that this effort can have on a student's ability to learn and retain information is really worthwhile. It's also a fantastic way for children to learn to self-regulate and learn about their own cognitive processes.

STUDENT ENGAGEMENT & WELLBEING OFFICER

CPS has employed a Wellbeing and Engagement Officer. Jessica Bruce (a qualified Social Worker) works extensively with children and their families who may be requiring additional support, either on a long term or short term basis. This form of support may be through, specialised counselling, engaging support services or counselling sessions. Any time you would like to make an appointment, just give our friendly office staff a call.



PREP - GRADE 6 BUDDY SYSTEM

Having a special buddy helps the new Prep children settle into their new environment more quickly and it helps them feel safe and special. Year 6 students pair with their Prep Buddies in activities such as "getting to know you" lunches, weekly games, listening to them read, helping in the playground and some excursions and lunchtime activities.





CANTEEN

We have a menu that supports healthy food with a large range of choice. Children are able to order from a wide range of foods on the menu for lunches. To order lunches please write the lunch order on a brown paper bag (orders on envelopes will not be accepted) with the child's name, grade and the correct money if possible. Orders are sent to the canteen each morning and collected again at lunch. The canteen operates Tuesday – Friday.

We welcome the assistance of parent volunteers. For more information about becoming involved, please contact the school.

LIBRARY

The Library is a well-stocked school resource that is always open during school hours, and during lunch times. Weekly library lessons are conducted where children learn borrowing and research skills and a love of literature is always encouraged.

HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

We have a specialist Physical teacher/co-ordinator employed to ensure the best quality health and PE program. It incorporates athletics, gymnastics, dance, ball handling, fitness, swimming, outdoor education and minor and major games. The program allows opportunity for all students to develop skills that will lead to participation in sports and leisure activities. Emphasis is placed on introducing the Fundamental Motor Skills Program and developing acceptable sporting behaviour and attitudes 1 hour per week. All junior grades also receive 1 hour of Perceptual Motors Skills program. Opportunities to represent our school and extend students in a variety of sporting fields are provided through inter school sports and zone & regional level competitions. We participate in various sporting clinics including T20 bash Cricket, Netball, AFL and Soccer.

Cobram Primary School also provides PE and sport specialist classes with the expertise of Skillzone coaches.



LUNCHTIME ACTIVITIES

At lunchtime we have Structured Play and Garden Activities. Also the Library is open every lunchtime. When the weather is extremely hot or wet, a movie is run for the students in either the multi-purpose room or one of the classrooms.

THE ARTS

Each class has an hour per week with a dedicated Art Teacher in the Art Room. It aims to develop creativity and appreciation by encouraging children to acquire and refine skills, techniques and attitudes. Activities are geared at the development of skills appropriate to children's needs, interests and abilities.

EXCURSIONS PROGRAM


